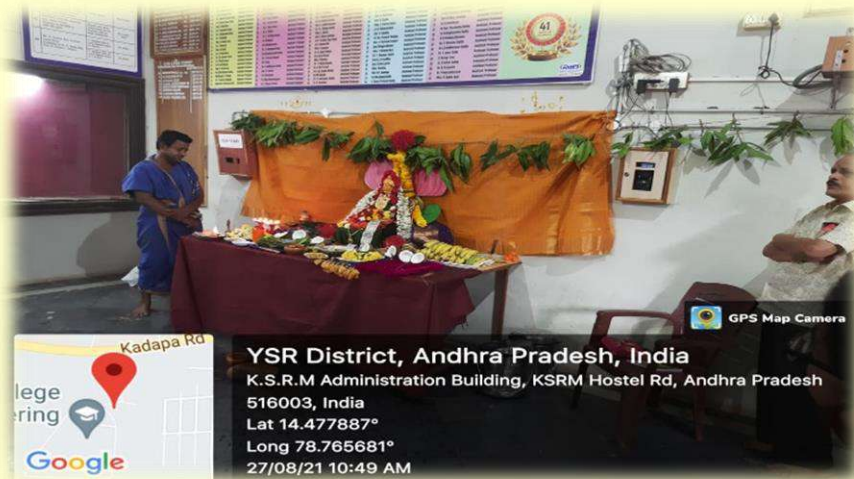
Raksha Bandhan –

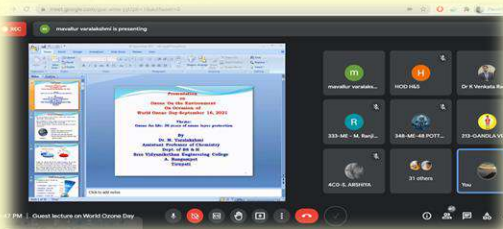
Engineers Day –

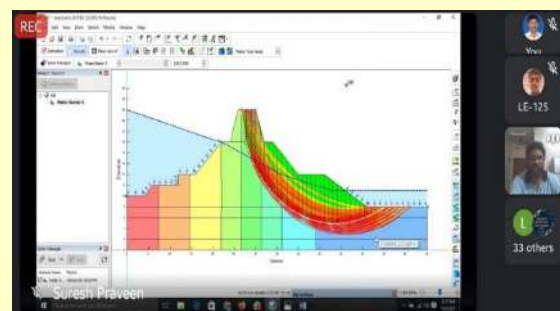
Gandhi Jayanthi –

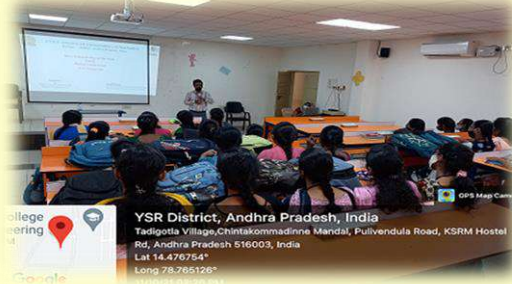
Karl von Terzaghi Day –

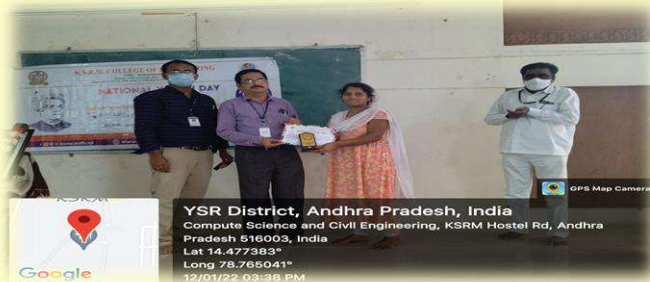
Women Teachers Day –

In 1946, he became the youngest minister in Jawaharlal Nehru's interim government, the first cabinet of India as a Labor Minister and also a member of the Constituent Assembly of India, where he ensured that social justice was enshrined in the Constitution. He went on to serve as a minister with various portfolios for more than forty years as a member of the Indian National Congress (INC). Most importantly, he was the Defense Minister of India during the Indo-Pak war of 1971, which resulted in the creation of Bangladesh. His contribution to the Green Revolution in India and modernizing Indian agriculture, during his two tenures as Union Agriculture Minister are still remembered, especially during 1974 drought when he was asked to hold the additional portfolio to tide over the food crisis.



Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Jayanthi –

The architect of Indian Constitution, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar - as the name suggests, who was a polymath and a civil rights activist. World Musical Day –

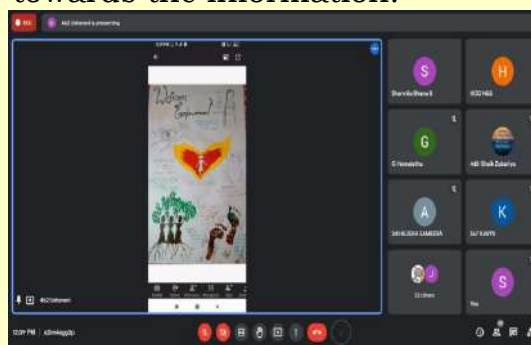

Lecture on Gender Equality in Education –

Lecture on Gender Discrimination Laws in India –

Gender discrimination has a deep impact on society as a whole. It does not just impact a specific section of the society but every part of it. First of all, it impacts children as they fall prey to gender stereotypes from a young age. Further, it impacts young people because it impacts their behaviour, study choices, ambitions, attitudes and more. Thus, many girls do not participate in many sports and women experience physical violence more than men. Next up, we have gender discrimination affecting adults because there is a gender pay gap between the working class. Men earn more for doing the same work as women. In addition, older women have more risk of becoming homeless than men. It also impacts the aboriginal women because they have it a lot worse. It is more likely to happen that they can die from family violence, 11 times more than men. Even for men, it is not beneficial as it sets difficult standards for men to follow. It draws a line on men being emotional. Thus, they can never showcase their emotions truly without being judged. Similarly, men do not parental leave in many places. Ultimately, all this results in more suicide in men. Thus, it impacts everyone.



Lecture on Corruption Free India –

Many countries around the world face the problem of corruption. India is one such country that is severely impacted by this problem. Corruption is the root cause of various other serious problems in our country. We can fight corruption if we stand united and are determined to drive this evil away. Here are a few ways to rid the country of corruption: Spread Education, Give Strict Punishment, Conduct Sting Operations, Follow the Right Course, Install Cameras and Recorders, Build Confidence. Therefore, there are many ways to free India from corruption. Only the willingness to implement these ways is required.



Road Safety Awareness –

Lecture on Right to Information Act -

Right To Information (RTI) Act 2005 mandates timely response to citizens' requests for government related information. Since every citizen pays taxes, therefore he is entitled to know how the government is functioning. The Act empowers every citizen to seek any information from the government, obtain copies of any government documents, inspect any government documents, works and records, and take certified samples of materials of any government work. The RTI Act extends to the whole of India except the state of Jammu and Kashmir. All bodies, which are constituted under the Constitution or are under any government notification, or all bodies, including NGOs, which are owned, controlled or substantially financed by the government are covered under the Act. All authorities covered must appoint their Public Information Officer (PIO). In addition, every public authority is required to designate Assistant Public Information Officers (APIOs) to receive RTI requests and appeals for forwarding to the PIOs of their public authority. Any person may submit a request to the PIO for information in writing along with the application fees, which is ₹10 for Central Government Departments and different for different states.



Lecture on Gender Equity and Human Rights –

Gender inequalities in the form of obstacles that prevent their free movement by which they enter the low-paid workforce are inimical to the interests of transnational corporations that rely on cheap female labour. A state who concentrates well the enforcement of respecting human rights is a good state. During decades the existences of human rights cases keep happening. They do violence and disobey the human rights norms and laws since they would enforce the goals that they set to other people through coercive actions. Most the high percentage of human rights violations happened in developing countries. Developing countries are still lack of knowledge and they are even still bad at the law enforcement.



Lecture on Equal Rights to Men and Women –

Men and women are not the same, and that is a fact just like all men are not the same, and all women are not the same. However, just because they are not the same does not mean that they should not be treated equally. The world has come a long way to ensure that gender equality is maintained in all areas of life. While the progress is impeccable, there are still a few societies that need to learn about gender equality. Discrimination against sex damages the community and causes retrogression. The reason is that a lot of potentials are left unexplored because one gender is caged. Some people do not want to embrace the thought of equality because they think it is all about giving women an advantage over men. That is a wrong perception of this noble course. Ensuring that men and women have equal rights is a matter of balancing the equation between them. It is about giving equal opportunities in all areas of life.



Lecture on Why Gender Equality is Good for Everyone? –

Gender equality, we face this issue head on by protecting girls from female genital mutilation, making sure they have the same educational opportunities as their male counterparts, and raising a generation of young men to respect women. We believe that everyone is equal in the eyes of God. And that he never meant us to live in a world with such harsh inequality. We work in countries where societies often treat women as second-class citizens. Our work in these countries seeks to combat this mentality. The girls attend school and dream of future careers that aren't affected by their gender. But gender equality is something that men have to be sold on as well, we believe that wholeheartedly.



Lecture on Legal Awareness about Women Related Laws –

For the last hundred years, there has been increasing awareness in the part of women for equal justice. Our Constitution grants them this right. But there is still a long way to go in many other fields of law affecting women. The Constitution and the different Acts passed by the Union Governments and the states give special protection to women, aware of their weak position. In spite of all these pieces of legislation loaded in favor of women, their condition is improving only at a snail's pace. Social taboos, tradition and poor literacy rate of women contribute to this situation. Owing to women's educational backwardness, many laws remain only on paper, most women not even hearing about them. Article 15 says that the state shall not be discriminate against any citizen on ground only of sex. No citizen shall, on ground only of sex, be subject to any disability, liability, restriction or condition with regard to access to shops, public restaurants and place meant for the use of general public.



Lecture on World Day of Social Justice –

World Day of Social Justice is to raise a voice against social injustice and to bring the various communities internationally together to eliminate poverty, gender, physical discrimination, illiteracy, religious discrimination to make a socially integrated society. To raise voices against social injustice and to remove barriers regarding gender, age, race, ethnicity, religion, culture, or disability, World Social Justice Day is observed.



Lecture on Women in Leadership –

Women are gradually making their leadership presence felt in entrepreneurship, administration, education, engineering, health, etc. at regional, national, and global levels. Women are now resolved to break the traditional glass ceiling that barred them from entering leadership positions even if they possessed requisite skills and talent to occupy them. Lecture on Consumer Rights –

They have the right to have full information about the quality, quantity, price, standard and purity of the product. It is to be mentioned, however, that consumer rights are solely for the consumers who buy a product for their direct use and not for reselling it. Consumer protection is considered to be falling under the arena of “private law.” It is a way of preventing consumers as well as the state from financial scams, financial frauds and bankrupt businesses. The consumer rights mentioned in the law are – 1. The right to be protected from harmful and hazardous goods and services. 2. The right to be informed in details about the quality as well as the performance of a good. 3. The right to freedom of choice of goods and services. 4. The right to be heard in all the decision-making processes which are related to the interests of the consumers. 5. The right to seek redressal on the infringement of consumer rights. 6. The right to the completion of consumer education.



Constitution of India –

Codified laws could further help protect them from the arbitrary action of institutions, individuals, or the state.
